

- Fewer than half of our degree-seeking students qualify for federal student aid.
- Only 3% of degree-seeking students receive foundation scholarships.
- Only 15% of students receive grants or scholarships from other funding sources.
- More than 40% of NWF students attend the institution without any type of financial support.

too common—a financial barrier which prevents or limits college attendance. Recognizing this, we strive to keep tuition low to enable more residents to take advantage of an exceptional learning environment to fulfill their academic and career aspirations.

For many individuals, personal financial constraints make the cost of tuition, books, transportation, and other associated expenses

just too great to bear. Unfortunately, financial aid programs are not keeping pace with the rising costs of college attendance. The *Take Flight Major Gifts Campaign* for NWF State College will provide help through new and expanded scholarship funding. Scholarships make the difference in a student failing to launch or *Taking Flight*.

Solutions

New and expanded scholarships will:

- Promote student retention and academic success;
- Enable students to focus on their studies instead of financial barriers;
- Reduce the level of student loan debt upon graduation;
- Accelerate the supplying of a skilled workforce to the local corporate community.

Our overarching goal is to increase the number of students enrolled in pathways to advanced education and employment.

Student Achievement Initiative

The mission of NWF State College is to improve lives. Our team of dedicated instructional and student success professionals support this mission by

providing the best in transfer degrees and an ever-expanding portfolio of job-readiness training.

However, the landscape of higher education is changing rapidly. To continue improving, to serve as an educational influencer and to stimulate regional economic growth, the College must implement emerging best practices.

NWF aspires to always be at the forefront of this change to prepare students for lifelong success. With an increasingly diverse student body, our challenge is to provide high-quality, relevant instruction

Opportunities

- Textbook costs are significant—on average for high-enrollment classes at NWF State College, textbooks cost one-third the amount of tuition for a three credit hour class; some are as high as two-thirds the tuition.
- 56% of NWF students enroll part-time indicating that many students must work to pay for educational and living expenses, thus require flexible scheduling for attendance and completion.
- The College's dual enrolled population has increased by 11% over the past five years and continues to grow as more students desire to begin college studies early.

that reaches students where they are, recognizes where they come from and takes them where they want to go.

Solutions

Enhancements for student achievement will:

- Create an Open Education Resource Fund (Increasing Access to Higher Education) which provides free online textbooks for high-enrollment courses;
- Establish on-demand online programs to meet the scheduling needs of highly transient populations, such as military students, who want to learn on demand and on the go;
- Connect faculty and industry leaders through a Teaching Innovation Center to jointly prepare students for tomorrow's workforce;
- Focus on preeminence by scaling nationally recognized best practices for early college, job placement and guided pathway programs.

Workforce Development Initiative

Opportunities

- 64% of jobs on the Regional Demand Occupations List for Okaloosa and Walton Counties require individuals to have an industry certification.
- By 2020, at the current rate, the U.S. will fall short by five million workers due to a lack of individuals who have earned industryrecognized certifications.
- Employees who possess an industry-recognized certificate can earn an annual income up to 20% higher than employees with no postsecondary education.

The ability of local industry to be competitive is directly related to the education and skills of its employees. Northwest Florida State College meets these strategic workforce needs through the development of emerging fields of study and through the realignment of existing academic programs.

Career educational programs are the backbone of the workforce in the Northwest Florida region. From health care to cybersecurity

and welding to public safety, students are continually earning degrees and certifications from NWF State College to join the workforce and keep it strong.

Among employers in Northwest Florida, one of the biggest challenges is finding qualified applicants to fill vacant jobs in an ever-changing marketplace. To close the skills gap, NWF State College will adapt to changing labor market needs and ensure career education and training programs are targeted to address those high-need areas.

Solutions

This initiative will:

- Fund educational initiatives and programs aligned to meet immediate and high-demand industry needs such as cybersecurity, physical therapist assistant, medical laboratory technician, pilot certification program, engineering technology (robotics, mechatronics), airframe mechanic and powerplant mechanic;
- Realign curricula in growing fields to keep pace with industry standards in fields such as computer science, health sciences, advanced technology and manufacturing;
- Enable NWF State College to equip classrooms and labs with the best emerging technology and fund related professional development for our faculty;
- Expand customized short-term training and industry-recognized programs such as hospitality, culinary, welding and emergency medical training;
- Integrate into the curricula student apprenticeships, internships, and co-op experiences to promote job-readiness and placement.
